I work for the DHSC on behalf of HMG assessing risks to the UK Vaccine programme. The programme's aim is to vaccinate the UK population to reduce death and serious injury from Covid 19 and allow the UK to return to pre-pandemic activity and normality.

Anti-vaccination groups pose a significant and identified risk to the programme. They spread mis and disconfirmation about the programme and the risks and potential harm of vaccination in both the digital and physical space and they cause disruption in the physical space at vaccination sites including schools. A number of individuals have been arrested for threatening behaviour and criminal damage.

While the DHSC welcomes legitimate protest, these groups and individuals are spreading deliberately false or misleading information. This has a negative effect on those elements of the population that may be hesitant or ambivalent about taking the vaccine and thereby increasing the risk of severe effects when catching Covid of which in unvaccinated individuals include long term harm or death.

PJH Law is involved with Anti-Vaccination groups and the dissemination of Anti-Vaccination messaging.

PJH Law shares misinformation to its recipients regarding:

- The location being "criminally liable" if they continue the vaccination programme
- The sharing of the Met Police crime reference number, claiming there is an active investigation into the vaccination programme

PJH Law are currently very active in an ongoing case regarding a Dr Sam White. The individual was allegedly suspended from the NHS for "speaking out about informed consent, the safety of the vaccine and other safe and alternative treatments." They have shared a link to a crowd funding page on their website and social media. The campaign have said the money will be used to assemble a team of QCs and Junior Barristers and lawyers to:

- Give advice on options.
- Draft applications.
- Represent in court.
- Prepare the cases for hearing.
- Engage any other legal support needed to ensure the best chance of success.
- To obtain expert and other witness evidence on:
 - PCR tests.
 - Trial design.
 - Efficacy of any safe alternatives.
 - Efficacy of masks.
 - Engage private investigators to carry out investigations into conflicts of interest and any other relevant issue.
 - Any other expert evidence Counsel advises us to obtain.
- To obtain expert tests on:
 - Materials used in masks commonly supplied and used in NHS settings.
 - Obtain toxicity reports for prolonged mask-wearing.
 - Obtain expert evidence of what materials are in the vaccines.
 - Any other expert reports Counsel advises us to obtain.
- An insurance policy to protect from any adverse costs orders.

It is likely that individuals from the public may believe these documents to be factually correct as it is endorsed by a law firm. The endorsement of misinformation by a regulated law firm

and the inability to differentiate between a crime reference number and an open police investigation indicates that the firm should be reported to the Solicitors Regulation Authority as misconduct.

The firm is involved in the propagation of false and damaging information that may increase vaccine hesitancy amongst the UK population that could result in serious injury and or death. This behaviour is not to the standard expect of a registered solicitor and action by the SRA must be taken as a matter of urgency. This behaviour has been brought to the attention of DHSC.
